

Fact sheet on Japanese assistance for displaced Ukrainians in the Czech Republic

1. Assistance for safe accommodation and systematic relocation

- > The project will be realized through “unlocking” existing accommodation units which are currently not available for social housing rentals and through an active outreach and working with the Ukrainian diaspora, as well as through the Migrant Resource Centres (CPIC) and municipalities.
- > Implementing organization: IOM
- > Budget amount: 1,372,611 USD
- > Implementation period: From January 2023 to January 2024

2. Assistance for stable status

- > The project will provide assistance to displaced Ukrainian refugees, including those with enhanced needs over the winter period, including access to legal/social services and monitoring with an aim to promote their stable stay in the Czech Republic.
- > Implementing organization: UNHCR
- > Budget amount: 317,296 USD
- > Implementation period: From 1 January 2023 to December 2023

3. Assistance for health (1st phase)

- > The project will strengthen cold chain capacities of the national immunization response (including Ukrainian refugee population), for COVID-19 and other vaccine-preventable infections. Overall, procurement of 295 refrigerators for the National Institute of Public Health, the Institutes of Public Health in Moravia, and in the Moravian-Silesian regions, as well as for 9 University hospitals is underway.
- > Implementing organization: WHO
- > Budget amount: 329,136 USD
- > Implementing period: During the 1st quarter of 2023, expectedly

*Financial support for 2nd phase of the assistance by WHO has been also decided and it will be implemented with an additional budget up to 10 mil. USD for the displaced people in Ukraine and neighboring countries.
